## LTL Training - London, UK – November 20<mark>19</mark>

### ENHANCING OUR OUTDOOR SPACES







Last year we started to enhance our backyard with the introduction of planters, tool shed with water catchment tank, a working bench, tyres and several loose parts for the early years. Learning experiences held in the back yard





At the beginning of this scholastic year (Sept 2019) maintenance works were carried out to the playing area (all woodwork was repaired and repainted)





The rubber tiled flooring which has suffered considerable damage from exposure and is presently unsafe will be replaced by artificial turf .

The wooden fencing around the football pitch was treated, fixed and given a fresh coat of paint. Moreover the existing artificial turfed surface, which has suffered considerable wear and tear, will be replaced with a new one.





However that was not enough. We needed to think harder and make the best out of what we had. A small grass area lying idle behind the football pitch, which was uneven and hard to dig, was levelled out and weeded by Green Club enthusiasts.



#### VISIT BY BIRDLIFE MALTA — Further assistance

was sought to consider structural changes especially to the internal yard. This is used as a kindergarten playing area. It is also occasionally used as an assembly area so the space is needed.




Possible long meandering flower bed to be introduced in the middle of the yard







